



Increased Access to and Utilization of Primary Health Care Services

We work to improve equitable access to quality primary health care (PHC) as a pathway toward achieving Universal Health Coverage (UHC). To achieve this, we prioritize high-impact PHC programs that drive positive health impact, particularly on women and young people. Key focus areas include reproductive, maternal, newborn, child, adolescent, and youth health and nutrition; water, sanitation and hygiene; disease prevention and control, and mental health. These efforts aim to improve overall health outcomes for our communities. We also prioritize designing integrated service delivery models and initiatives that emphasize quality improvement, leverage technology for more efficient PHC systems, and promote digital inclusion to ensure equitable access for all.

We work towards advocating for the social determinants of health and addressing the health-related challenges that intersect with broader social issues. Our aim is to empower women and young people through five key interventions: enhancing livelihoods, mitigating the impact of climate change on health, promoting gender and social inclusion, encouraging positive behavior change, and building the capacity of civil society organizations (CSOs) to support social accountability.

Strengthened Resilient Health Systems

To effectively address primary health care (PHC) needs and manage emerging health threats, it is essential to strengthen integrated health systems that support both health and preparedness. Our approach to building more resilient community health systems focuses primarily on three key areas: human resources for health (HRH), health care financing, and leadership, management, and governance (LMG). Additionally, we emphasize the implementation of robust health information systems to support data-driven decision-making and improve system efficiency.
