

Kenya Sanitation and Hygiene Improvement Programme (K-SHIP)






Programme Scope

KSHIP is a 5-year Global Sanitation Funded (GSF) Programme, with a grant budget of **US\$ 5,100,000**. Through sanitation and hygiene improvement, the programme aims **to contribute towards the broader goals of poverty eradication**; **health and environmental improvement**; **gender equality** and **long term social and economic development**.

The programme targets are to:




The programme has 6 components:

- Sanitation & Hygiene Promotion
- Equity & Inclusion
- Capacity Development & Sanitation
 Marketing
- Advocacy & Communication
- Coordination & collaboration
- Evidence Based Documentation & Learning.

Some Results Thus Far

- Reached and sensitised 1.536 million people on improved sanitation and hygiene practices
- 718 villages certified as ODF
- 540,987 people living in Open Defectation Free environments
- 57.5% reduction in costs to deliver an ODF village
- Households are investing to acquire improved sanitation facilities. Median cost was Kshs 2,000 or US\$ 20 in Murang'a to Kshs 30,000 or US\$ 300 in Nakuru
- Unlocked US\$ 548,480 (KSH 54,848,000) non-GSF funds in 4 counties (Migori, Embu, Kwale and Wajir) at a ratio of 1 GSF KSH to 3.6 Non-GSF KSH
- Strengthening National and Sub-Nationan institutional frameworks including Policies, strategy, guidelines, capacities and monitoring systems.

With the learning accrued on the approaches, the established structure and model of implementation; KSHIP remains relevant to continue contributing to the national sanitation and hygiene agenda to eradicate open defecation and to **declare Kenya ODF by 2020** and to achieve **SDG 6.2**.

- Scale-up market based sanitation approaches;
- Continue reaching the last mile;
- Contribute to exploring the utility of container based sanitation;
- Continue contributing to strengthening the national and sub-national institutional framework;
- Continue unlocking investments for sanitation and hygiene;
- Contribute to the Universal Health Agenda.
