USAID Imarisha Jamii is a USAID Kenya and East Africa funded Activity that aims to increase the use of quality county-led health and social services in Turkana County, Kenya. It is an integrated health and social services program that focuses in areas of HIV; Family Planning, Reproductive, Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health (FP/RMNCAH); Nutrition; and Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC) program.

## 1. JOB PURPOSE

The Nutrition Technical Officer will provide technical support in the implementation of nutrition interventions in collaboration with other technical officers. The job holder will be based in Turkana County and will provide hands on technical support to County Health Management Team (CHMT) and other actors to strengthen Nutrition interventions in Turkana county.

Plan and execute quality improvement plan through High Impact Nutrition Interventions (HINI) gap analysis in targeted health facilities while ensuring that County/Sub-County Nutrition Officers and facility in-charges take lead in adequately addressing identified gaps Lead the identification of specific community groups mother to mother and father to father support groups (MtMSGs and FtFSGs included) whose capacity will be strengthened to enhance adoption of feasible enterprises/income generating activities (IGAs), together with establishment of home gardens. The groups will also be assisted to register as recognized entities – this will be achieved in close collaboration with the civil society organizations (CSOs). Work closely with the County and Sub-County Nutrition Coordinators, together with other relevant stakeholders to ensure dissemination and operationalization of County Nutrition Action Plan (CNAP) Capacity Plan and execute capacity enhancement action plans, to include the building ongoing mentorship program targeting Health Care Workers, Community Health Volunteers and CSOs while guided by the approved work plan Capacity build County Health Management Team, Sub County Health Management Team, Health Care Workers and Community Health Volunteers in rolling out revised national guidelines in Turkana county including Maternal Infant and Young Child Nutrition (MIYCN), Baby Friendly Community Initiative (BFCI), Breastmilk Substitutes (BMS Act), Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition (IMAM), Micronutrient Supplementation and Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) Research Plan and execute regular feedback sessions with community and Advocacy members, Health Care Workers, Community Health Volunteers and the civil society organizations (CSOs) to advise programming Lead the project in nutrition advocacy efforts and allocation of resources for evidence-based nutrition interventions Monitoring and Uphold Collaborating, Learning and Adapting (CLA) through routine **Evaluation** and documentation of success stories, both at the facility and documentation community levels. This will be achieved in collaboration with the communication team Support collation, analysis and reporting of nutrition related data for the purposes of programming and lessons sharing. Support compilation of all program reports, including quality annual and quarterly reports and monthly narratives to the donor
