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PART A: TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 1: Introduction

Amref Health Africa, headquartered in Kenya, remains the largest Africa-based international non-governmental organisation currently running programmes in over 35 countries in Africa with lessons learned over 60 years of engagement with governments, communities and partners to ensure sustainable health access in Africa. Amref Health Africa also incorporates programme development, fundraising, partnership, advocacy and communication offices in Europe and North America as well as subsidiaries including Amref Flying Doctors, Amref International University (AMIU) and Amref Health Innovations.

Amref Health Africa in Kenya is an independent non-profit, non-governmental organization (NGO) founded in 1957. The organization has a footprint in all the 47 counties, that is both physical and through partners. Amref in Kenya believes that the power for lasting transformation of Africa's health lies within its communities and works side by side with individuals in communities to empower them to build the knowledge, skills and means to transform their own health.

Amref Health Africa's Strategy Goal is to advance Africa's health by catalyzing an evidence-based movement aimed at reducing the gap between communities and the rest of the health system using a series of programme drivers that are crosscutting and process-based. The programme themes that will lead to realization of the strategy are partnership with communities for better health; building capacity for strengthened communities and health system responsiveness and health systems research for policy and practice.

Amref Health Africa's vision is for lasting health change in Africa and is committed to improving the health of people in Africa by partnering with and empowering communities, and strengthening health systems. Our mandate is executed through a systems approach through the following programme areas: HIV/AIDS, TB and Malaria, Health Systems Strengthening (HSS), WASH & NTDs, RMNCYAH, and Non-Communicable Diseases.

Section 2: Background Information

Since COVID, Oxygen has emerged as one of the essential commodities in the management of COVID-19 specifically for cases requiring breathing support making it critical to have adequate and consistent supply. Pre-COVID-19, availability of oxygen was low across Kenya particularly in the public health facilities estimated at 16%, and where available the supply has not been optimal and lacked the necessary distribution and delivery infrastructure to the user points. Some progress has been reported in the recent past as counties and facilities have established infrastructure to support oxygen therapy. Some installed oxygen-generating plants, a few installed bulk liquid oxygen tanks while others set aside resources to procure more oxygen in cylinders as well as investments in the diagnostic tools in the form of pulse oximeters.

Despite these investments, access barriers have been observed. In places where onsite generating plants are available, these were piped to one or two units therefore limiting supply to a few patients. Equipment failure and lack of spare parts have also been reported in this category. Where cylinders are used, these are by the bedside per patient- a situation to improve..

Amref Health Africa in Kenya through the Global Fund COVID-19 Response Mechanism (C19RM) is supporting the following infrastructure works;

- 1. Supply of oxygen through procurement of liquid oxygen, onsite generating PSA plants and cylinders;
- 2. Installation of high-volume supply capacity through bulk liquid tanks, PSAs and centralized manifolds accompanied by oxygen piping to bed outlets; and
- 3. Supply of oxygen therapy kits (humidifiers, regulators, flow meters) to facilities using cylinders.

In this regard, Amref Health Africa in Kenya seeks to recruit biomedical engineering Consultants to provide expertise to supervise the above infrastructure works. The consultants will work closely with Amref Health Africa in Kenya team, the Ministry of Health, and the County Health Departments.

Section 3: Key Tasks

The biomedical engineering consultant(s) will provide technical supervision to the contractors in the provision of oxygen in the focus counties in Kenya. The consultant will work closely with the Amref team to ensure the installation and commissioning of the procured equipment for delivery of oxygen takes place at identified sites.

The assignment requires travel to various sites as per the clusters listed in Annex 1.

The successful consultant(s) will be allocated facilities in any of the clusters listed in Annex 1 (to be determined by Amref Health Africa) and contracted to supervise the facilities in each cluster(s) and will be expected to make at least 3 trips per facility in the cluster awarded as per the stages indicated in 5.1 of this document and cover at least 2 facilities per day owing to most of them being in close proximity.

Section 4: Key Responsibilities

4.1 Reporting to the Amref Oxygen Project Team:

The individual BME consultant(s) shall;

- 1. Prepare and submit an inception and implementation plan per LOT;
- 2. Provide working schedules and supervision plans in the form of a Gantt chart. This shall be a project overview and scope abstract' with methodology with measurable factors involved in a robust, safe and operational Medical Gas Piping System (MGPS) for Oxygen delivery.

4.1.1 Stage 1: Preliminary:

- 1. Involving Facility and County Biomedical Engineers in suitable site identification, determination of terminal outlet points and taking measurements for the piping and oxygen supply installation requirements. This will be done if the need for assistance is identified by a contractor.
- 2. Ensure all sites are ready for the installation of Liquid oxygen, PSA plants and piping & manifold systems by providing working drawings to the contractors, for each site using information from the Amref Oxygen Project Team, Provided BoQs and the county BMEs data.
- 3. Thorough inspection of Equipment for quality and standards compliance for each component of the oxygen ecosystem and supply network. e.g. Plants, Cryogenic LiOX Tanks systems, manifolds, copper pipes and outlets as well as electrical standards for the power panels.
- 4. Inspection for compliance with the standards and Memoranda like HTM 02 part 2, ISO 7396-1: 2016 and ISO 13485 (Medical Gas Piping System installation, tests and compliance assessments) for the materials, installation process and on installed and commissioning works.
 - a. These shall include but not be limited to the following;

- i. Handling to maintain the inertness of the copper pipes and outlets as well as the manifolds.
- ii. Pipeline cacarsing, chasing and trunking workmanship acceptance.
- iii. Harnessing infrastructure and standards such as height and anchoring strength.

4.1.2 Stage 2: Work Supervision:

The Consultant(s) will share traveling plans for each site to be visited for approval by the Amref Oxygen Project Team.

- 1. Provide a signed and stamped site attendance sheets as a proof the site visit.
- 2. Dully fill the provided supervision template with the following considerations;
 - Inspect, qualify and quantify the delivered materials, equipment and machines and create inventory for the same at all sites.
- 3. Adhere to work ethics in all sites.
- 4. Ensure work schedules are adhered to and manage variances in time, scope and budget.
- 5. Involvement of the appointed site managers (e.g County/facility Bio Medical Engineers, public works officers among others) in work harmonization.
- 6. Submit weekly reports of work progress and manage contractors' activities to achieve set project timelines and standards.
- 7. Ensure compliance to medical gases work safety at work regulations and rules.
- 8. Provide an appraisal report on the performance of the contractors.

4.1.3 Stage 3: Testing, Commissioning and Handing Over:

- 1. Jointly with the Contractor conduct and document Testing and commissioning of oxygen provision in the facilities. This shall include but not limited to the following (as per HTM 02 part 2, ISO 7396-1: 2016 and ISO 13485 standards);
 - Pressure tests
 - Leakage test method and compliance values
 - Flow rate test method and results
 - Oxygen purity and cleanliness.
 - Interaction, compatibility and automatic changeability to the other primary or secondary sources of oxygen.
 - Confirm that the User and Technical training for BMEs has been conducted and countersign training certificates/reports.
 - Draw and adapt a monitoring tool for maintenance schedule during the Contractors warranty period.
- 2. Facilitate contractors work handover reports to Amref Oxygen Project Team for sign off of the completed works.
- 3. Submit final project report to the Amref Oxygen Project Team for review.

Section 5: Amref Health Africa Obligations

Amref Health Africa will facilitate the successful consultant(s) with the following;

- 1. Transport to and from the facilities
- 2. Accommodation
- 3. Lunch, Dinner and Out of Pocket allowances as per Amref Rates

Section 6: Period of Performance

The implementation period is expected to run from March 1st 2025 to December 31st 2025 or until the contractors complete the assigned works, whichever comes first. The contract shall come to an end at the closure of the assigned works (tie the consultant to the assigned vendor's works)

Section 7: Deliverables

- 1. Site inspection reports
- 2. Work supervision reports
- 3. Signed Off Installation and variation management.
- 4. Endorsed Testing and commissioning report
- 5. Endorsed Completion Certificates and reports.

1. Amref Health Africa invites proposals from eligible biomedical engineering firms and consultants to provide expertise in biomedical engineering and to supervise oxygen infrastructure projects as outlined in the lots below;

- 8. Prices quoted should be inclusive of VAT and all other applicable taxes and must be in Kenya Shillings and shall remain valid for 90 days from the closing date of the tender. The prices in your financial quotation should be broken down as follows: (Do not key in your financial quotation in this section).
 - i. Daily Consultancy Rate
 - ii. Less 5% Withholding Tax
 - iii. Net Consultancy Fee

NOTE: Global Fund grants are tax-exempt. Bidders will be required to submit quotations inclusive of 16% VAT. Payment(s) to the successful bidder(s) shall be made in total exclusive of VAT and a tax exemption certificate will be issued accordingly. Successful applicants shall be required to submit a proforma invoice and valid tax compliance certificate upon receipt of LPO for processing of specific VAT exemption certificates.

Section 9: Instructions to Tenderers

- 9.1 Eligible Tenderers.
- 9.1.1 This invitation for tender is open to all eligible tenderers.
- 5.1.2 Tenderers shall not be under a declaration of ineligibility for corrupt or fraudulent practices.

9.2 Cost of tendering.

9.2.1 The tenderer shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid. Amref Health Africa or its agents, will under no circumstance be responsible or liable for those costs regardless of the conduct or outcome of the tendering process.

9.3 Specific Instructions

- 9.3.1 Bidders must quote for services as requested in order to qualify for evaluation.
- 9.3.2 The final submitted proposal shall be in English.
- 9.3.3 The proposal submitted should be in PDF Format.

9.4 Amendment of documents

- 9.4.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Proposals, Amref Health Africa for any reason, whether at its initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective tenderer, may modify the tender by amendments.
- 9.4.2 All prospective candidates who have received the tender will be notified of the amendment in writing or by post and will be binding on them.
- 9.4.3 In order to allow prospective tenderers reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing their bid, Amref Health Africa at its discretion may extend the deadline for the submission of Proposals.

9.5 Prices and Currencies

- 9.5.1 The tenderer shall indicate on the appropriate Price Schedule, the unit prices inclusive of all taxes and the total tender price of the items proposed to be purchased under the contract.
- 9.5.2 Prices quoted by the tenderer shall be fixed during the tender validity period and not subjected to variation on any account. A tender submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and will be rejected.
- 9.5.3 The price quoted shall be in Kenya Shillings.

9.6 Validity of Proposals

- 9.6.1 Proposals shall remain valid for 90 days after the date of tender opening prescribed by Amref Health Africa. Tenders valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by Amref Health Africa as non-responsive.
- 9.6.2 In exceptional circumstances, Amref Health Africa may solicit the tenderers' consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing. The tenderer may refuse the request. A tenderer granting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its tender.

9.7 Deadline for Submission of Proposals

9.7.1 Proposals must be sent so as to be received by Amref Health Africa through the provided email address not later than Friday 07th February 2025 at 11 AM (EAT), 8 AM GMT (UK), and 11 AM (CET).

9.8 Modification of Proposals

- 9.8.1 The tenderer may modify or withdraw its tender after the tender's submission provided that written notice of the modification, including substitution of withdrawal of the Proposals, is received by Amref Health Africa prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Proposals.
- 9.8.2 The tenderer modification or withdrawal notice shall be prepared, sealed, marked, and dispatched in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 2.10:1. A withdrawal notice may be sent by email but followed by a signed confirmation copy, postmarked no later than the deadline for submission of tender.
- 9.8.3 No tenderer may be contacted after the deadline for submission of Proposals.

9.9 Withdrawals of tender

9.9.1 No tender may be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submission of Proposals and the expiration of the period of tender validity specified by the tenderer.

9.10 **Opening of Proposals**

- 9.10.1 Amref Health Africa will open all Proposals virtually in the presence of tenderers' representatives who choose to attend on **Friday 07**th **February 2025** at **11 AM (EAT), 8 AM GMT (UK),** and **11 AM (CET)** through the meeting link provided in the tender.
- 9.10.2 The tenderers' names, tender modifications or withdrawals, and the presence or absence of requisite tender security and such other details as Amref Health Africa, at its discretion may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening.
- 9.10.3 Amref Health Africa will prepare a tender opening report.

9.11 Clarification of Proposals

- 9.11.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation and comparison of Proposals Amref Health Africa, at its discretion, may ask the tenderer for a clarification of its tender. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing, and no change in the prices or Substance of the tender shall be sought, offered, or permitted.
- 9.11.2 Any effort by the tenderer to influence Amref Health Africa in the tender evaluation, tender comparison or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the tenderer's tender.

9.12 Evaluation and Comparison of the Proposals

- 9.12.1 Amref Health Africa will examine the Proposals to determine whether they are complete, whether any computation errors have been made, whether required securities/tender purchases have been furnished, whether documents have been properly signed and whether the Proposals are generally in order. After examination, a tender that will be determined to be substantially non-responsive will be rejected by Amref Health Africa.
- 9.12.2 Amref Health Africa will evaluate and compare the Proposals, which have been determined to be substantially responsive.
- 9.12.3 Amref Health Africa will notify bidders who will be required to provide samples in good time with specific sample submission details following the finalization of the preliminary evaluation.
- 9.12.4 Amref Health Africa will ensure that the submitted samples are catalogued accordingly and correspond to the assigned bid number(s). The tenderers should ensure that all their samples have been captured correctly.

9.13 **Notification of Award**

- 9.13.1 Prior to the expiration of the period of tender validity, Amref Health Africa will notify the successful tenderer in writing that the tender has been accepted.
- 9.13.2 Simultaneously the other tenderers shall be notified that their Proposals have been unsuccessful.

9.14 Appeal Period

5.14.1 Any vendor/service provider who wishes to appeal against the outcome of the tender shall do so in writing within 3 working days of the date of the notification/regret letter. Any letter received after the third day shall not be responded to and shall be treated as null and void. Amref Health Africa shall have dispensed with this procurement.

9.15 Contacting Amref Health Africa

- 9.15.1 No tenderer shall contact Amref Health Africa on any matter relating to its tender, from the time of the tender opening to the time the contract is awarded.
- 9.15.2 Any effort by a tenderer to influence Amref Health Africa in its decisions on tender evaluation, tender evaluation committee, or contract award will result in the rejection of the tenderer's tender.
